This week we have continued our learning on the story 'Clem and Crab' with a focus on character descriptions. The children all created a series of brilliant sentences to describe the crab. I was very impressed with some of the fantastic detail the children included in their descriptions including the crabs 'pointy pincers'!

Yesterday the children did us all proud on our trip to Sandfield Farm. They listened brilliantly to the instructions, joined in with all elements of the trip and used their fantastic manners. Our trip leader Emma commented on how impressed she was with the children's manners and kindness towards each other. We had lots of fun exploring the different elements of Emma's farm and learning about food production. The children were particularly impressed to find out that the milk from the cows on the farm goes to McDonalds! Our afternoon was spent in the play wood, it was wonderful to see the children independently demonstrating the skills that they have refined in our Forest School over this year.

In phonics this week we have been consolidating our Level 4 learning with a focus on tricky words. The children have enjoyed playing a range of games to support their confidence when recognising these new words, a favourite within the class was 'I spy the tricky word!'. In maths we have continued to explore shapes and shape arrangements. The children have been composing shapes, decomposing shapes and creating pictures using 2D shapes.
