We have continued our learning on the story 'Clem and Crab' this week with a focus on character descriptions. The children all created a series of brilliant sentences to describe the crab. I was very impressed with some of the fantastic detail the children included in their descriptions including the crabs 'pointy pincers'! On Wednesday we had a very busy and exciting afternoon. We started by heading outside on a minibeast hunt, the children enjoyed exploring the school grounds looking for different bugs and insects. We identified different habitats and worked as a team to search for them. The children then created a tally to record how many minibeasts they found around school. After this, we headed inside and quickly got into our P.E kits ready for an exciting dance workshop with Mrs Newbury. In phonics this week we have been consolidating our Level 4 learning with a focus on tricky words. In maths we have continued to explore shapes and shape arrangements. The children have been composing shapes, decomposing shapes and creating pictures using 2D shapes.
