Year 5 Geography Trip to Diglis Fish Pass, Worcester

As part of their Geography curriculum, Year 5 enjoyed a fantastic visit to Diglis Fish Pass in Worcester, where they explored the River Severn, Britain's longest river and learned about how rivers are used, managed and protected.

During the visit, the children took a guided walk along the river path, developing their understanding of river features, human impact and the importance of rivers to the environment. They learned about the River Severn's journey, the fish that live within it and how weirs can affect fish migration.

A highlight of the trip was visiting the impressive fish pass structure. Pupils examined the engineering involved in its design, linking their geography learning to STEM by taking part in a hands-on engineering activity, in which they designed and tested model structures to help fish move safely upstream. This deepened their understanding of how humans can adapt environments to reduce negative impacts.

Once the sporting events have concluded, parents are welcome to collect their children from their classrooms to enjoy a picnic together, so there will be plenty of time to spend together afterwards.
