### Parent Governor Vacancy – Get Involved in Our School Community

We currently have a vacancy for a Parent Governor on our school's Governing Body and warmly encourage parents and carers to consider putting themselves forward.

The Governing Body plays a vital role in the life of the school. Governors work together with the Headteacher and senior leadership team to ensure that every child receives the best possible education. They help to set the school's strategic direction, monitor progress and standards and ensure that resources are used effectively.

#### What does a Parent Governor do?

As a Parent Governor, you would bring a valuable perspective, representing the views of parents while contributing to the wider decision-making of the school. The role includes:

- Attending full governing body meetings and committee meetings - approximately 2 per term over "teams."
- Contributing to discussions on school policies, priorities and performance
- Supporting and challenging the leadership team in a constructive way
- Acting in the best interests of all pupils

No specific qualifications are required. What matters most is a commitment to improving the school and the ability to work as part of a team. Training and support are available for all new governors.

#### Who can apply?

All parents or carers of registered pupils at the school are eligible to stand for election. Whether you have experience in education, finance, business or simply a strong interest in supporting the school, your skills and perspective would be welcomed.

#### Why become a governor?

This is a rewarding opportunity to:

- Make a real difference to children's education
- Develop new skills and gain valuable experience
- Play an active role in the school community

If more candidates come forward than there are vacancies, a ballot will be held.
