Comic Relief

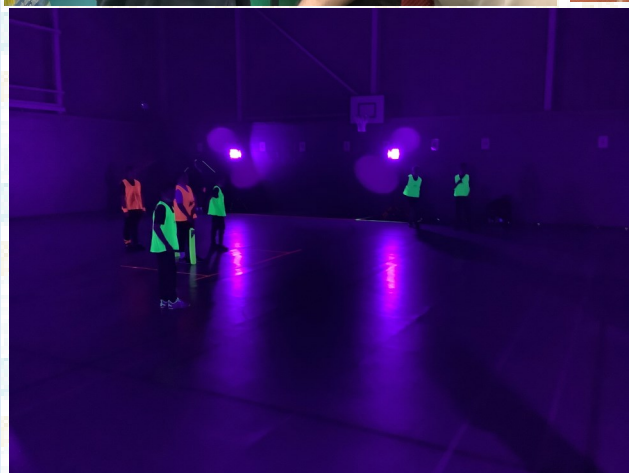
Thank you for all the support with Comic Relief. We raised £75.00 which is really appreciated. The children looked wonderful and had lots of fun wearing their red noses!
